



SULLIVAN RENAISSANCE 2012 MINI GRANTS

Sullivan Renaissance will make a limited number of grants **of up to \$200** available to groups or entities that would like to participate at a “mini” level by planting a new garden, improving an existing landscape, removing debris and sprucing up or improving signage. Preference will be given to new applicants that provide matching funds and/or services.

Sullivan Renaissance supports projects that are sustainable and incorporate good environmental practices. Recipients must be aware of the materials they are using, the location of the project, and the use of invasive plants. Good garden design and practices are essential components, and each project must incorporate an appropriate choice of plant materials,

This is a reimbursement grant program. Applications will be accepted on a first-come first-served basis as funding is available. Applications must be completed in full and include a “before photo” of the project area to be improved and property owner permission. In addition to the grant, Sullivan Renaissance can provide assistance with design and plant selection. If approved, a site visit will be conducted to provide feedback.

Upon approval, recipients will receive an award letter and W-9 form. When the project is completed, applicants must return the signed W-9 form with “after photos” and receipts in order to receive reimbursement. All projects must be completed and documentation submitted by **August 6, 2012**. When documentation is received, a check (not to exceed \$200) will be sent in the name of the initial applicant. Grant recipients will also be recognized at the annual Sullivan Renaissance Awards Ceremony on **August 13, 2012**.
